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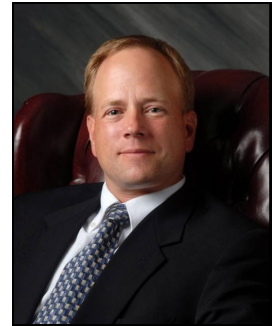

Message from the President

Although all of us as CPCUs should live each day of our lives with high ethical standards in mind, the CPCU Society has designated March as the month devoted to Ethics Awareness. In this month, we should consider our own behavior to determine if it exemplifies the conduct worthy of the CPCU designation and its Professional Code of Ethics. I challenge you to read through these Canons once again and, as you read them, consider how your own lives reflect each of them.



1. CPCUs should endeavor at all times to place the public interest above their own.
2. CPCUs should seek continually to maintain and improve their professional knowledge, skills, and competence.
3. CPCUs should obey all laws and regulations, and should avoid any conduct or activity which would cause unjust harm to others.
4. CPCUs should be diligent in the performance of their occupational duties and should continually strive to improve the functioning of the insurance mechanism.
5. CPCUs should assist in maintaining and raising professional standards in the insurance business.
6. CPCUs should strive to establish and maintain dignified and honorable relationships with those whom they serve, with fellow insurance practitioners, and with members of other professions.
7. CPCUs should assist in improving the public understanding of insurance and risk management.
8. CPCUs should honor the integrity and respect the limitations placed upon the use of the CPCU designation.
9. CPCUs should assist in maintaining the integrity of the Code of Professional Ethics.

Consider joining your fellow CPCUs in Johnston at the Hilton Garden Inn on March 24 for our Ethics Seminar. In cooperation with Drake University, we have prepared some interesting speakers. Among them are Bob Cooper, Professor at Drake University, and Charles Schwepker, Professor of Business at Central Missouri. The seminar will center on an article Mr. Schwepker helped co-author entitled, "Salesperson Ethical Decision Making: The Impact of Sales Leadership and Sales Management Control Strategy." Bruce Kelley, our chapter's Ethics Chair, will once again be the Master of Ceremonies. I hope to see you there.

Our February 17 meeting had a tremendous turnout as 82 of our members attended. Charlie Kingdollar of General Reinsurance presented "Personal Injury Claims Arising from the Internet." He discussed many interesting points, including how the current wording on many policies is inadequate. Being a "published" author is a lot easier now than in the past, and our lives and the lives of those for whom we care most deeply can be affected by content put on the internet.

2011 Scholarship News for Iowa Chapter Members

This spring, the Iowa Chapter of CPCU will again be awarding up to two \$1,500 scholarships, one of which is the Ted Lussem Scholarship, to Iowa Chapter members and/or their dependents. This has been a very successful program and we are glad to continue to offer this opportunity to our members.

The scholarships are available to graduate and undergraduate students. To be eligible, graduate applicants must be an Iowa Chapter of CPCU member and attend an accredited graduate college or university. 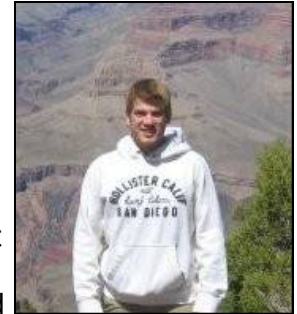

How are you involved with CPCU Society, and when did you become a member?

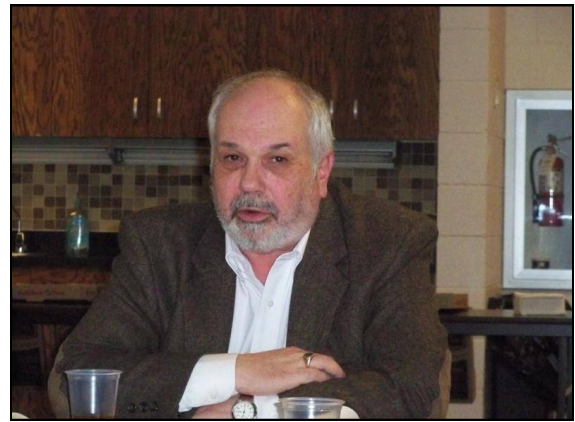

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: Charles H. Schwepker, Jr. (Ph.D., University of Memphis) is the Mike and Patti Davidson Distinguished Marketing Professor at the University of Central Missouri. He has experience in wholesale and retail sales. His research interests are in sales management, personal selling, marketing ethics and consumer behavior. His articles have appeared in the *Journal of the Academy of Marketing Science*, *Journal of Business Research*, *Journal of Public Policy and Marketing*, *Journal of Personal Selling & Sales Management*, *Journal of Service Research* and *Journal of Business Ethics*, among other journals, various national and regional proceedings, and books including *Marketing Communications Classics* and *Environmental Marketing*. He has received both teaching and research awards.

FEATURED SPEAKER: Robert W. Cooper, PhD, is the Employers Mutual Distinguished Professor of Insurance at Drake University. Prior to coming to Drake in 1988, he was dean of the Huebner School at the American College where he was responsible for updating the CLU (Chartered Life Underwriter) professional designation program and for designing and managing the implementation of the ChFC (Chartered Financial Consultant) program. He received his BS degree with highest honors in insurance from the University of Connecticut and his PhD degree from the University of Pennsylvania. When subsequently published as a book, his doctoral dissertation titled *Investment Return and Property-Liability Insurance Ratemaking* won the Elizur Wright Award given annually by the American Risk and Insurance Association for the publication that made "the most significant contribution to the literature of insurance."
