CHARLES BENJAMIN (C. BEN) CONDON Seventh President of the Iowa Chapter of CPCU

On Friday, March 19, 2004 "Ben" died of a heart attack in Florida. Ben was born on February 17, 1926 in Des Moines and graduated from Dowling High School going on to Notre Dame graduating in 1949. In November of that year he joined LaMair & Mulock, Inc as a Sales Trainee.

Ben received his CPCU in 1953 and became a partner in the agency that fall. The name of the agency was changed to LaMair-Mulock-Condon, Co. (LMC) in 1966, and he went on to become Chairman of the Board of the agency, before retiring in 1991.

Ben was the 7th president of the Iowa Chapter of CPCU for the 1958-1959 year. (It should be noted that he was the first of seven members of LMC to be president of our chapter) He also served as LMC's representative to Assurex International for over 25 years and served as that organization's president in 1971-1972.

In May of 2003, Ben was inducted into the Iowa Insurance Hall of Fame recognizing his achievements and contributions to the insurance industry.

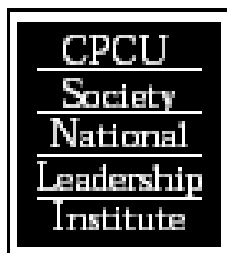
